Volunteers and Certified Coaches must comply with all Georgia 4-H policies and guidelines and have signed all materials necessary, including but not limited to the Volunteer Agreement and 4-H Code of Conduct. The Risk Management Training online module must be completed as well. These materials must be updated nn.

All 4-H'ers must be between the ages of 9-19 and complete a 4-H Enrollment form and 4-H Code of Conduct. Discipline is very strict for safety reasons.

- * A 4-H 'er can be removed from the team if he/she exhibits inappropriate behavior or if they are creating enough of a distraction to create a safety concern. There will be zero tolerance for carelessness when handling equipment. We want 4-H 'ers to have a good time, but kids need to have an appropriate attitude during practice.
- * Keep these clothing guidelines in mind: halter tops, backless shirts, one-shoulder tops, shirts with spaghetti straps, tube tops, extremely tight clothing, visible midriffs, revealing pants, or clothing that advertises alcohol or tobacco products are NOT allowed. Sleeveless shirts and tank tops may be worn as long as they are modest, and girls' straps need to be wide enough to touch the shoulders or at least 1 to 2 inches wide.
- * No loose or dangling clothing or jewelry that may interfere with the safe operation of a bow is allowed.
- * Closed-toe and closed-heel shoes must be worn (no sandals, flip-flops, or croc-style shoes).
- * Coaches may deem an article of clothing unsafe. If this occurs, every effort will be made to assist the archer in allowing practice to continue. The intent is to maintain a safe shooting environment, not to exclude an archer from practice.
- * Headphones, earbuds, or other electronics will not be allowed at practice.

The White County Extension Office reserves the right to limit the **n** on the archery team depending on the adult-to-child ratio. Safety is of the utmost importance; therefore, if we feel there is not enough supervision prior to the start of the season we may choose to regulate the number of participants
